# ANNUAL REPORT FROM GOVERNORS

## 2024 - 2025

Ysgol Gyfun Heolddu Comprehensive School is an English-medium, mixed 11-18 school situated in Bargoed and serving the surrounding areas of Gilfach, Aberbargoed, Deri and Tirphil. The school works in collaboration with 3 other local schools to provide a joint sixth form.

There are currently 740 pupils on roll (an increase of over 200 pupils over five years) including 80+ in the sixth form. The school hosts three satellite classes for Trinity Fields special school and a Learning Pathways Centre for school-to-school support with targeted intervention.

31% of pupils are eligible for free school meals at previous count 44% of pupils live in the 20% most deprived areas of Wales. 16% of pupils have additional learning needs. 2.3% of the school population speak English as an additional language and 97% pupils are from white British backgrounds.

The school was last categorized YELLOW B in January 2020 and was removed from Estyn review November 2019.

### Election of Parent Governors

When a vacancy arises in the Governing Body for a parent representative, the school will inform all parents of the vacancy and will make the necessary arrangements for the consequent election. Every parent of a registered pupil at the school will be entitled to stand as a candidate and to vote at the election and will be given the opportunity to do so. Each parent will be sent a ClassCharts message, which will indicate eligibility to stand, nominate and vote in elections and which will include a nomination form and personal statement. Elections will be by confidential ballot.

### **Governing Body Annual Parents' Meeting**

There were no parent meetings held by the governing body during the course of this year. Should any parent wish to request such a meeting, please contact Miss L Harris at the school where further information can be provided.

Please be advised that the '*Schools Standards and Organisation Act 2013*' has removed the requirement for School Governing Bodies to hold an Annual Meeting with parents. However, new arrangements mean that you have the right to request up to 3 meetings in any school year with the Governing Body. For this to take place, the following 4 conditions need to be met:

Parents will need to raise a petition in support of holding a meeting.

- The meeting must be called to discuss matters which affect the school. It is not designed to discuss individual matters. The petition should include brief details of the matter to be discussed and the reasons for calling the meeting.
- Parents can use this right to request up to 3 meetings with a school's Governing Body during the school year.
- There must be at least 25 school days left in the year when the petition is received in order that the meeting can be held. A 'school day' means a day when the school is open to pupils and does not include weekends, public or school holidays or INSET days.

### **Additional Learning Needs**

Ysgol Heolddu Comprehensive School ensures that pupils with ALN including pupils with a disability are admitted on an equal basis with others in accordance with its admissions policy. Parents are encouraged to visit the school to discuss their child's needs with the Headteacher and ALNCO (Additional Learning Needs Coordinator) Ms. C. Jones.

Currently, 16% of the school has an Additional Learning Need with 4.4% having an IDP or statement of educational needs.

### **Cymraeg**

Welsh is taught as a second language to every pupil in years 7-11, meeting our statutory requirements. Teachers are supported to develop their use of basic Welsh, where they can, across the school to converse with and praise pupils. The school promotes pupil use of incidental Welsh and rewards this using ClassCharts.

## Pupil Records

Pupil records are kept electronically on the SIMS and ClassCharts systems. Parents can access up-to date information via a personal ClassCharts app and also track their child's progress using Go4Schools. Any parent requiring login should contact their child's pastoral leader.

## Attendance information

Whole-school attendance for the year reached 90.2%, an improvement on last year's 87.7%. This is above both the Wales average (89%) and Local Authority (LA) average (89.6%). Attendance among pupils eligible for free school meals (FSM) also improved, rising by 3.4% to 86.3%, above the national (81.1%) and LA (84.5%) averages. Non-FSM attendance rose to 92%, exceeding the Wales average of 91.2% and improving from last year's 88.8%. These improvements reflect the impact of whole-school strategies and a strong focus on engaging pupils and families.

We continue to monitor pupils' attendance closely in order to work with families to overcome barriers to school attendance and ensure all pupils are given the support required to help them access their education and achieve their full potential.



## Health and Safety

The school site continues to be well maintained and effectively managed by our dedicated site team, ensuring a safe and secure environment for pupils, staff, and visitors. We do not sublet our facilities, with the exception of the drama studio, which is used by the local leisure services for community classes and parties. During the last academic year, we experienced an issue with rainwater causing localised flooding in one area of the school, and we are currently working closely with the local council to resolve this matter. All rooms are in active use as teaching

spaces, apart from one classroom that remains closed following recommendations from a previous fire risk assessment.

## **Staffing and Professional Development**

The school teaching and support staff has continued to grow alongside the growth in pupil numbers. As of September 2025, we have 51 teachers and 23 support staff.

## **Links with Community and Parents**

The school continues to place great importance on strengthening relationships with parents, local organisations, and the wider community. Over the past year, we have been proud to build and celebrate these connections through a range of activities and partnerships, including:

- Achieving the Silver Community-Based School Award, recognising our strong commitment to community engagement.
- Hosting a Christmas in the Community event, supporting families through the provision of hampers and gifts.
- Maintaining close links with Gwent Police, supporting community safety initiatives and pupil wellbeing.
- Working with Young Carers services to ensure support and recognition for pupils with caring responsibilities.
- Collaborating with local businesses and charities to enhance learning opportunities and promote social responsibility.
- Taking part in the Festival of Remembrance, where students represented the school with pride and respect.

These initiatives reflect our ongoing dedication to fostering meaningful connections between the school, families, and the wider community.
